Winter Sports Teams and Sideline Behaviour

Many thanks to our parents, staff, student coaches and managers who volunteer to work with Chilton sports teams throughout the year. The Sports Department appreciate their efforts and expect that they, and the players they stand alongside, receive a positive experience from engaging in sport.

In light of the recent case of umpire abuse that was reported in the press, it was good to hear Sport New Zealand CEO, Peter Miskimmin discuss, in a number of forums, the importance of positive sideline behaviour by adults and his reminder to parents and other supporters to be mindful of their behaviour on the sideline, as... it does matter. Data shows that youth engage in sport for fun, friendship and to develop skills. The messages they receive from their supporters on the sideline as they play (and on the car ride to and from the venues!) are integral to this enjoyment, or otherwise.

We ask that parents and supporters be vocal to an appropriate level, be positive, ask your child what they enjoyed about the game they just played and tell them why you enjoyed watching them. Sport NZ are asking those involved in youth sport not to de-prioritise winning but rather to re-prioritise enjoyment, participation and involvement.

PRESCHOOL

This term Preschool Music have begun to investigate music from around the world. The children have enjoyed bopping around with streamers as we have listened to some American jazz and many of them enjoyed the opportunity to have a go blowing the trumpet. It was impressive to see with how many managed to play some notes – we have some budding jazz musicians amongst them!

We have also looked at some different types of music from around the Pacific beginning here at home in Aotearoa. We have enjoyed playing some Te Rakau, stick games as we have practised our rhythm skills and the older children have begun to use some notated rhythmic patterns whilst they are playing. The preschoolers have loved using poi to swing as we have learnt some simple songs in Te Reo and have been keen to show how fast their poi can spin around in circles! Our most recent country focus has been the tropical island of Samoa.

We listened to some Samoan drumming and then investigated the sounds that a variety of different pacific percussion instruments made. The long Pate drums and coconut shells were a favourite!



We have continued to enjoy many opportunities to sing and dance and it is super to have almost every single preschooler keen to sing a little solo good morning song as they enter the classroom.
