Kea Group

Our Kea preschoolers have been very busy starting their new Unit of Inquiry into how being responsible with waste can positively impact the environment.

To give the children an idea of how much waste we produce, last week the Preschoolers collected two days' worth of rubbish from their lunch boxes. The teachers emptied out all the rubbish and asked the children where they thought it came from.

We talked about the different types of rubbish and sorting it into different categories. The Kea children discovered that some of the rubbish can be recycled or composted; this rubbish was a bit smelly! Some of the rubbish could be reused like our plastic bags and yogurt pots. We also found out that we had a lot of rubbish, like gladwrap and chippie packets, that could not be recycled or reused that would have to go to the rubbish dump.

The Preschoolers will look into ways they can reduce the rubbish that goes to the landfill and keep recycling responsibly.
