Cooking is a fun and enjoyable way to help Preschoolers learn and practice good hygiene, healthy eating, fine motor skills, mathematics concepts, literacy, science and language skills. It also provides opportunities for children to try out different food and experience the joy of sharing food with friends and family.

Incorporating our letter of the week (Y for yeast), the Maui group made their very own bread rolls. First of all, we washed and dried our hands. Then we measured the ingredients; flour, salt, sugar, yeast, warm water and milk. Next we poured warm water into the yeast and the children made some great observations:

"It smells yucky" – Hugo

The girls have inquired into the measurements required for:

- Making clothes (Caitlin Lorimer, Sophie Ross and Dhani Patel)
- The distance you can throw a Gumboot (Madeline Reid and Ella Brader)
- The depth in the sea where you can see certain sea creatures (Divya Patel and Jasmine Sunkel-Morta)
- Working out the dosage and cost for worming pills for cats and dogs using their weight (Alisa Fleisher and Kate Shan)
- The lunch you could buy from our tuck shop if you had ten dollars to spend (Isabella Todd)
- The use of standard measurements versus non-standard measurements (Savannah Currie and Janice Wu).

To ensure authenticity in their learning, the girls have interviewed and questioned members of staff as well as students, the tuck shop staff as well as contacting a local vet. The highlight may have been the gumboot throwing competition with Mrs Hughes, Mr Wong and Mrs Blush joining in! (they were very competitive!).

I learnt that I could measure length using a tape measure and a metre ruler. (Maddy Reid)


It has been a fun challenge to figure out the measurements for some clothes and I am proud of my team's work.
