- To provide students with an opportunity to explore multiple perspectives
- For students to synthesize and apply their learning of previous years and to reflect upon their journey through the PYP
- To provide an authentic process for assessing student understanding
- To demonstrate how students can take action as a result of their learning
- To unite the students, teachers, parents and other members of the school community in a collaborative experience that incorporates the essential elements of the PYP
- To celebrate the transition of learners from Primary to Middle School education.

The girls were given the question “What does Exhibition mean to me?” Here are some of their initial responses:

- Exhibition is when people display what they have researched. First you pick a topic, then you research, then you display! You do this in a group
- You have a question and get grouped with the people with similar questions, study about the topic and display your information
- I think it is Inquiry but 10x bigger
- Exhibition is when your tutor chooses a topic and you have to make your presentation connected to that topic. It can also mean working with people around you to make a successful presentation
- I think Exhibition is about sharing your research with others and exhibiting your knowledge. It is about helping other people’s mindsets
- Research, creativity, concentration
- Research, presenting work neatly, working hard, Art, Inquiry, discovering
- Exhibition is like a showcase of your ideas and past work. You get a topic and then brainstorm ideas. Once you’re finished you get into groups and start work on it.

At the end of the Exhibition process we will reflect on our initial thoughts and see if we still think the same. Watch this space!
