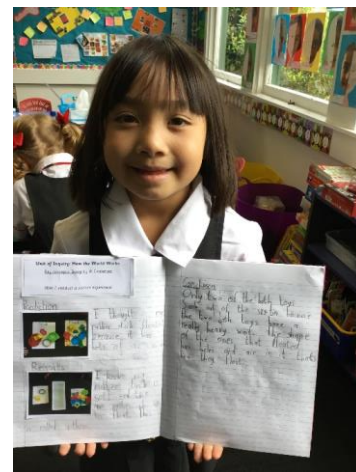
PRIMARY SCHOOL

Year 2

As part of our Unit of Inquiry into How the World Works, the girls have been conducting science experiments and investigating forces and motion, including: gravity, friction, magnetism, air resistance and buoyancy.



Eden: I found out that the boat was full of air and that's why it floated. There was a deep hollow inside and walls on the outside, which made it float. None of the other items had that and they all sank.



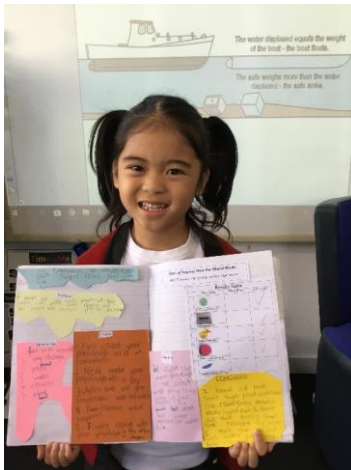
Lorena above: I predicted that the objects with holes in them would sink to the bottom of the water because they let water in. My prediction was mostly correct, although some of the bath toys with holes floated because of their shape. I thought the rubber duck would float because it has air on the inside.



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Sacha *below*: I wrote a whole science experiment which was called: 'Why do some shapes float and some shapes sink?'



The girls designed their own sketches to demonstrate their understanding of gravity. They painted these sketches using watercolour paints and used a range of hot and cold colours. Some girls chose to paint a scene of the world to show how objects are pulled to the earth's centre, others painted Isaac Newton's famous apple tree.



Orla *left below*: I know that gravity is a force that pulls things to the centre of the earth. My picture shows that there is no gravity in space but the apple and the penguin are being pulled to the earth, even though they are at different poles. That's because of the earth's magnetic field that pulls things to the poles.



Krithikaa *above right*: We used marbles and paint to investigate forces in action. When we tipped the box up, the marble rolled through the paint because of gravity. We saw friction in action too! The marble rolled at a different speed through the slippery paint than it did on the smooth clean paper. I love my artwork.
