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MIDDLE SCHOOL



Last Friday, Year 8 students were lucky enough to have Michelle Dickinson, author of "The Kitchen Science Workbook" visit. The girls describe below what they did during their session and what they learnt:

"We looked at how sound can be made louder. You tie a piece of string through the top of a cup then you get a paper towel and put it around the piece of string, then pull the paper towel up and down the piece of string so it makes a soft noise but if you wet the paper towel, and pull it up and down, it makes a noise like a chicken. This is because of friction." (Gemma)

"I learnt that everyone is an engineer if you make things and want to know how things work, even if you don't work or are trained to be one." (Radhika)

"The best part for me was learning about her career, about how she used to work for people like Apple and Elon Musk. I found it very interesting and inspiring." (Florence)

"At the Kitchen Science session we made coloured noodles using water from red cabbages. We boiled the cabbages to extract anthocyanin, which is what makes red cabbage purple. We put noodles in the water containing anthocyanin, which turned them purple. Afterwards we put lemon juice in some and baking soda in others, which turned it pink and blue. I learnt that red cabbage contains anthocyanin which is a natural pH indicator." (Cordelia)
