

Year 10

The Year 10 students are on their third week of Cambridge examinations. All the Middle School subject teachers and Form teachers wish the Year 10 students well in their remaining papers.

Year 9 Mathematics: The Year 9 girls are finishing up their Bivariate Statistics posters. It was a good experience for them to physically measure and collect their data from the Library. It gave the students a chance to delve into the analysis of errors and improvements once they had the practical experience to support their discussions.

Year 8 Mathematics: The two Year 8 classes are nearing the end of their Statistics topic. Next week will see them putting together all that they have learnt in this topic. They will be expected to explore an investigative question, collect the relevant data, draw the appropriate graphs, calculate the necessary statistics and analyse for patterns and trends. The girls will have a range of options for their final output format.
Year 7 Mathematics: These past few weeks, the Year 7 students have been enjoying the practical applications of Probability and exploring the theoretical reasoning that support said applications. They are currently putting the final touches on their chosen project which requires an experiment with dice. The next topic is 3D Geometry, which is always a lot of fun.
