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PRIMARY SCHOOL

Year 3

The Years 3 and 4 have been inquiring about mixtures and solutions in their How the World Works Inquiry. They have completed many experiments, including discovering if and how a solution can be separated out again, how to make solutions and what makes a solution and what is a mixture. The Central Idea was Developing Sound Scientific Processes Can Lead to Discovery. For their final task they were given five liquids and the question, Is it an Acid or a Base? If they followed the procedure they have learned about, they would make a hypothesis, identify the liquids, check the Ph level using litmus paper and the Ph scale, observe the results and write a conclusion. As would be expected, they had varying results and understanding. However, the main thing to come out of it was, every single girl loved being a scientist!
