Proactive are back providing physiotherapy services at Chilton. A physiotherapist is onsite between the hours of 8.00am and 11.00am every Tuesday during the school term. The physiotherapist can treat a range of injuries or dysfunction as well as referrals to specialists as needed. This service is free for all school students and staff and as long as the injury is covered by ACC (ACC will cover injuries that have been caused by an accident that has happened within one year of your initial assessment but do not cover longstanding issues/pain eg arthritis). 

## PRESCHOOL

### Kea Group

For Mathematics the Kea group have been focusing on measurement. The children have been looking at measurement vocabulary and common measurement tools. The Keas have had the opportunity to use tools such as balancing scales, kitchen scales, rulers, measuring tapes and number lines to measure the length and weight of all kinds of objects. The Keas also used all kinds of Preschool equipment (mobilo, chains, blocks, small cubes, stick bricks) to measure themselves, their friends and other objects around Preschool both inside and out. We even measured the roof!

All the children enjoyed the experience of being measured and comparing themselves to their friends. The Kea height chart is displayed on the wall in the Kea room and the children often look at their photo and talk about who is taller or shorter.



## PRIMARY SCHOOL

**Year 2:** This Term the Year 2 girls are inquiring in to 'Who We Are'. They have been investigating the Central Idea: Choosing to act responsibly can positively affect our relationships. The girls have been working on social skills by applying morals from a range of stories. They designed self-portraits and decorated these with their own character attributes.

**Harper:** I learnt from the story of 'I'm The Best' that dog wasn't the best at everything. Everybody has something that they are the best at!



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




Year 2 girls enjoyed designing 2D shape pictures of themselves. They labelled the properties of the shapes they chose. What wonderful creativity, girls!

## MIDDLE SCHOOL

### Science

Middle School students have been doing a number of interesting things in Science. Both the Year 10 Combined Science classes have just completed a subject unit and done a test on it. They have been studying the three sciences on a three-week rotation, which will continue until the course is complete.

10S has been studying Physics topics with lots of calculations and formulas and will now move to Biology. They have made some remarkable posters on the advantages and disadvantages of renewable and non-renewable energy resources. They interpreted and drew a speed-time graph of a car chase from the Batman movie, which they enjoyed doing. They also learnt how pressure is affected by area and revised the different forms of Energy.

10C have been studying Chemistry and will then move to Physics topics. They have been studying the atomic structure and bonding of compounds. They learnt about protons, neutrons and electrons and how to draw electrons in the shells of different atoms. They studied both ionic and covalent bonding for compounds, and revised the different methods of separating substances.

Year 9 are currently studying the Particle Theory of Matter. They have been learning about the changes of state, diffusion and how heat transfer works. They have been doing lots of practical work and experiments to go with this topic. They have also been looking at how all this applies to everyday phenomenon.
